Head to Walmer Castle, one of London's cosiest and most historic pubs, for the ultimate Burns Night celebration. Dating back almost 180 years, these walls have seen their fair share of parties. Join the team for all the revelry the community has come to expect while sipping on craft ales and tucking into Scottish specials, including Cullen skink with smoked haddock and raspberry cranachan with mascarpone cream, oats, Scotch whisky and a drizzle of honey.
