





Having recently reopened after careful restoration and redesign by interior guru Isabella Worsley, The Walmer Castle has been reimagined into a traditional English tavern blending history, charming interiors and great food. Honouring the building's storied history that dates back to 1845, and its enviable location on Ledbury Road, the independent pub is home to a characterful bar on the ground floor, with dining spaces offered upstairs.

Throughout the establishment, historical maps and references of Notting Hill's eclectic past sit among antiques sourced from markets and dealers on nearby Portobello Market and Golborne Road. The kitchen is helmed by chef Luaan van der Watt, who has created a menu which is wonderfully simple but satisfying, sourcing produce from London butchers, The Ginger Pig, and exclusive seafood purveyors, Flying Fish. Menu highlights include charcuterie and an array of English cheeses, cured Cornish mackerel tartlet, Somerset pork tomahawk and pub classics such as fish and chips, Wiltshire beef burgers, and Creedy Carver chicken.
